



# Eastern Federal Lands Highway Division Buenos Aires National Wildlife Refuge Road Project AZ FTFW BUAI 10(3), 11(1)



## Project Description

## Newsletter – December 20, 2019

Route 010 of the Refuge is 2.3 miles in length and will receive full depth reconditioning and pavement for about 2 miles with the remaining 0.30 miles constructed with new aggregate base course and paving. Route 011, Pronghorn Loop Road is approximately 10 miles in length and will receive full depth reconditioning, reshaping and aggregate surface course. The Headquarters parking area will be reconstructed with new pavement, curb, sidewalk and overlook.



### Road Surface conditions

The roadway is chip sealed from the junction of State road 286 and the refuge headquarters with gravel and natural surface around the Pronghorn Loop road.



### Current and Upcoming Work

Construction work is currently scheduled for 5 days a week from 7:00 am to 3:00 pm Monday - Friday. Upcoming work includes scarification of the existing surface of the Prong Horn Loop Drive to prepare the subgrade for improvement and aggregate base course placement.



### Traffic Delays

There are no delays or detours to traffic accessing the Refuge Headquarters at this time.

The Pronghorn Loop road is closed during the week for construction but will be open to traffic on the weekends. Drivers should expect rougher than normal driving conditions.
